1996 ASP AWARD WINNERS

The following grants have been made by the Society in 1996. Congratulations to all recipients.

Awards and Grants for Students

To stimulate interest in all phases of natural products research, the American Society of Pharmacognosy is offering the following awards and grants:

1. Undergraduate Research Awards.

The ASP Undergraduate Research Awards consists of a stipend of \$2000 to the student and \$500 to the advisor to help defray the costs of the research. There are no limitations on the type of research to be conducted other than that it should be in the area of natural products

2. Lloyd Library and Museum Travel Grants.

This grant program was established in cooperation with the Lloyd Library and Museum. In keeping with the Lloyd Library's interest in promoting student activities, a \$500 travel award to attend the national ASP meeting will be awarded. These awards will be made based on excellence in both scholastic and research activities in the field of natural products. This year's winners are:

3. Travel Grants for Graduate Students.

Graduate students under the supervision of a Society member are also eligible for a travel grant of \$300 to

\$500 to enable them to attend a Society meeting and present a paper.

4. Kilmer Prize

This consists of a gold key, suitably inscribed. The APhA makes available a complimentary registration and up to \$300 to enable the winner to attend the meeting at which the award will be given. The Society also provides an honorarium of \$300 for the named recipient.

1. Research Starter Grants.

ASP small research grants from \$2000 to \$5000 are available for active members in the first eight years after earning their Ph.D. and in the first five years of their first independent career position. These are one-time awards and are not subject to indirect costs.

2. Travel Grants for Active Members.
