

Wild About Wildflowers: An Exploration of Our Native Plants

Did you know Ohio has almost 50 species of native orchids, one of the most in the nation? Or that our region has native cacti and carnivorous plants? Or that many local native plants are endangered species? Or that the pawpaw is Ohio's official native fruit?

This fall, the Lloyd Library & Museum joins forces with the Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Garden, and the Cincinnati Wild Flower Preservation Society, who celebrates its 100th anniversary, to explore our region's native plants in the exhibition *Wild About Wildflowers*. The exhibition will feature wildflower and native plant photography by Brian Jorg of the Cincinnati Zoo with historic photography, art, manuscripts and artifacts from the three organizations' dynamic collections. Experience carnivorous plants and other live specimens on display.

When a brushy cedar thicket in Adams County first attracted the attention of Dr. E. Lucy Braun in the early 20th century, it would have been impossible to predict the impact it would have on conservation in Ohio. Today Lynx Prairie is just one tiny portion of the nationally significant Richard and Lucile Durrell Edge of

Appalachia Preserve System, which encompasses 20,000 acres and protects over 100 species listed as rare or endangered.
