



# Curtis Gates Lloyd Research Fellowship Announcement

The Lloyd Library is proud to announce the Curtis Gates Lloyd Research Fellowship for 2018

---

The fellowship is for a period of 1-3 months for research based on resources within the Lloyd Library collections. Research topics can include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Medicinal Botany
- Chemistry
- Natural History
- Early Travel and Exploration
- Ethnobotany
- History of Science, Medicine, and Pharmacy

**Fellowship stipend:** Successful applicants from the local region will receive \$1,750 stipend per month, and successful applicants from outside the region will receive \$2,500 stipend per month. Any expenses incurred beyond the amount of the fellowship are the responsibility of the Fellow.

## Requirements:

- Successful candidates will hold a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree or equivalent in a field relevant to the work they want to pursue for their fellowship, Master's Degree preferred.
- Fellowship to be completed in one month increments, from one to three months. Please specify desired fellowship period in your application.
- Fellows will be expected to work at the Lloyd Library at least 2 full days, per week for the duration of their fellowship.
- Fellowship is for research purposes for individuals only.
- Applicants must be citizens of the United States or be a U.S. lawful permanent residents.
- Fellowship must be completed within the period from March 2018 to December 2018.

**How to Apply:** Interested candidates should submit completed applications in writing, via email, which includes the following:

- A concise and well written research proposal (at least two pages, but no more than four, single-spaced) explaining how the Lloyd's collections are essential to the candidate's research. Provide concrete examples of materials to be utilized over the course of the fellowship.

- Provide context, where relevant, of how this projects fits into a larger body of work in your field.
- List of prior publications, if applicable. Arts applicants should include copies of prior work samples.
- Current resume or curriculum vitae.
- Two letters of reference.

Expected Outcomes:

- Public lecture, or other presentation, with the approval of the Fellowship Committee, on the topic of research.
- Acknowledgement of the Fellowship and the Lloyd Library in print publication or other appropriate venue.
- Fellows must supply a copy of any publications that result from this work (book, journal article, etc., for the Lloyd Library's archival records.

No applications will be accepted from past Fellowship recipients for a period of at least three years from their prior award.

Applications are due January 31, 2018.

Award decisions will be made no later than the end of February. All applicants will be notified of the Fellowship Committee's decision no later than early March regarding their individual applications. Recipients must respond in writing to confirm acceptance of the Fellowship and will be required to provide a digital photograph of them for publicity.
