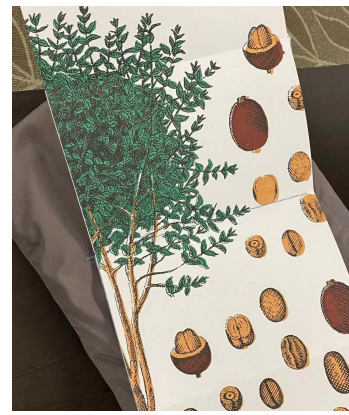
Lloyd Connection to Mayan Research



In last week's [episode](#) of NPR's *Weekend Edition*, University of Cincinnati professor and ethnobotanist David Lentz discusses his research on the ancient Mayan system of water purification and agriculture. His research has included work at the Lloyd Library with glass plate negatives taken by library co-founder Curtis Gates Lloyd, who captured life in Mexico circa 1900.
