With the plant-focused collections at the Lloyd, it's easy to overlook our small collection of books on shells and mollusks, including an 1842 edition of George Brettingham Sowerby's <u>A Conchological Manual</u> (pictured left). The Sowerbys were a family of natural history illustrators, with George being the son of James Sowerby, author and illustrator of *English Botany*. The Lloyd has books in which 8 different members of the Sowerby family were involved, either as illustrators, authors, printers, or booksellers.
