Abstract

The collection consists chiefly of correspondence between Morgan and C. G. Lloyd and Davis L. James from the 1880's to the early 1900's. Also includes some miscellaneous correspondence. The writings of A. P. Morgan are in published form, some book and some sections from various journals.

Biographical Sketch

Andrew P. Morgan was a pioneer in the botany of the Miami River valley. While his interest included flowering plants, as noted by his Flora of the Miami Valley, Ohio, his special interest was in fungi. It was he that interested Curtis G. Lloyd in the study of fungi, and encouraged and worked with Lloyd during Lloyd's beginning studies.
