Abstract

James S.H. Potter graduated from the Eclectic Medical College in 1894. He moved to Baltimore in 1895, where he established a successful practice. In 1932 he traveled to Southern Ohio and the Northern Kentucky area, visiting the sites of found in John Uri Lloyd's novel "Stringtown-on-the-Pike." The collection contains a scrapbook about the 1932 trip; a reprint of "John Uri Loyd: Rebel" by Murray Breese, *The American Druggist* (Jan. 1929); and correspondence between Mrs. Potter and her cousin Mary O'Conell.
