Flourish Exhibition Opening

In early 2020, Melissa Haviland, artist-printmaker from Athens, Ohio, came to the Lloyd to research our collections in preparation for her



project, *Flourish*. The resulting exhibition runs September 10 through November 20 and features screen prints installed on wallpaper, reflecting her research into early travel and botanical illustrations with a focus on cash crops.

This ticketed opening event offers time slots at 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. with reduced capacity. Masks are required and will be available at the door. Registration Required.



We're spotlighting one of the books that inspired artist-in-residence Melissa Haviland's upcoming exhibition at the Lloyd. Timothy Sheldrake's circa 1768 work *Botanicum Medicinale* brings together not only information on plants used in medicine of the time, but 118 hand-colored engravings of these plants. One of Haviland's pieces is a screen print based on Sheldrake's radish illustration (<u>Plate 82</u>) pictured here. The entire book has been digitized from the Lloyd's copy, and is available to <u>view here</u> through the Biodiversity Heritage Library online resource.
