Mary Vaux Walcott: Envisioning Nature through Art

In celebration of Women's History Month, we'd like to introduce Mary Vaux Walcott (1860-1940). Born in Philadelphia, Walcott began painting at age eight, becoming an avid naturalist with a special interest in geology and wildflowers. In 1925, the Smithsonian Institution published a collection of 400 of her



paintings entitled *North American Wild Flowers* (illustration of *Gentiana saponaria* or harvestbells pictured).
