Brought from Turkey to Cincinnati in the early 20th century, ceramic pieces from the Lloyd's historical collections will be on display alongside American apothecary jars and a work created by 2019 Lloyd Artists-in-Residence Future Retrieval. This mini-exhibition runs from March

13-24 in conjunction with CURRENT, the annual



conference of the <u>National Council on Education for the Ceramic Arts</u> to be held in Cincinnati March 15-18. The Lloyd joins over 60 area venues in sharing ceramic exhibitions, and welcomes conference attendees and members of the public alike.


foundational works in American forestry.
