## **Lloyd Board Member Named "Eco Champion"**

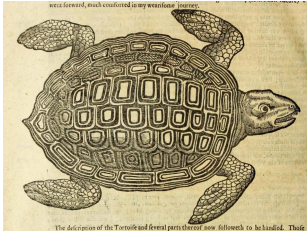
