A New Look at a Historical Garden

Just arrived at the Lloyd! The books pictured, collectively known as *Hortus Eystettensis*, are striking replicas of those published in 1613 by Basilius Besler, a German apothecary and botanist. This boxed set of three volumes features breathtaking illustrations and text, with additional material and translations for modern readers. The pages capture hundreds of plants from many lands planted in the garden of the prince-bishop of Eichstätt, Bavaria.
