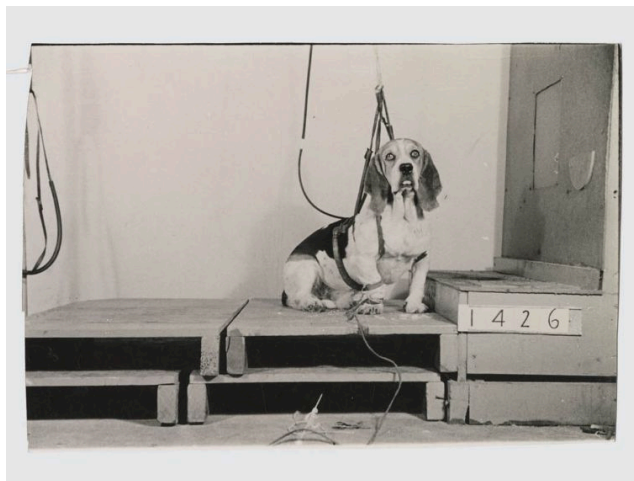
More-Than-Human Medicine Opening Reception

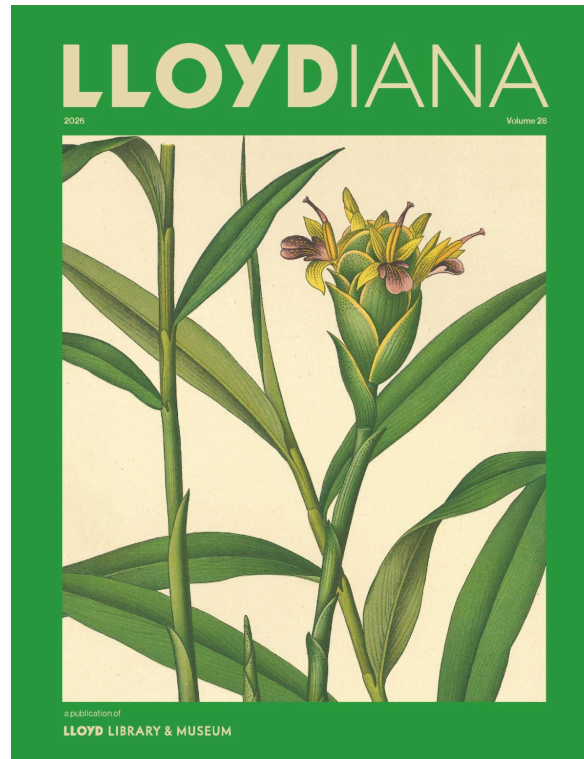
